Volunteer Opportunities for Parents

(GP)Teacher Appreciation: We love our storytellers and doorpeople and honor their call to share the sacred stories with our children. One week in May we need parents to facilitate cards or notes from the children and help the Christian Ed director to arrange a small event during class time to show our appreciation.

(GP)Helping in the classroom: We are often looking for parents who are able to be a doorperson in the classroom. This entails greeting the children as they enter at 925, being the eyes and ears of the classroom management and helping to facilitate response time and feast. Christmas Pageant: A time honored event that can be a free form or as traditional as the volunteers would like. Be as involved (running the show) or periphery (helping with costumes) as you like, just let us know on the front side!

(J2A) Fundraising leader: Help to coordinate the fundraising. Each Pilgrim's family is responsible for coordinating one fundraiser. Choose from one of the regulars; coffee, cupcakes, rent-a-pilgrim, car wash, or chili; or come up with a new idea!

Other Youth Opportunities

Baptism: Children are welcome to participate in Godly Play at any stage in their religious journey, however, many lessons refer to the Baptism experience. St. John's baptizes people of all ages, and if you are interested, please indicate by circling on the reverse side and you will be contacted by the rector to schedule a time for baptism.

Communion: While the church no longer requires that children take a class and receive their "First Communion", Communion class is still recommended. Communion class is open to all children over 6 years old and teaches the what, where, when, why and how of the Holy Eucharist. It is offered each spring and is celebrated in the church service with the students setting the altar and participating fully in the service in this important rite of passage.

Acolyte: Those adults and youth over 10 years old (fourth grade), who are interested in being part of the service by assisting Reverend Munz, should indicate by circling on the reverse. Paul Benoit will contact you with information on training and scheduling. On days when they are serving, students should arrive in time to put their robes on before coming to class, and will be dismissed at 950 to serve

Confirmation: Offered every other year, youth and adults are encouraged to fully join the Episcopal family. Preparatory classes are part of the J2A curriculum, taught by Reverend Munz, and conclude with ceremony presided over by the Bishop. [Adults have the opportunity to take the "Foundations Cass" to prepare them for confirmation, or reception. Contact Rev. Munz for more information.]

Choir: Grant Moss welcomes youth in Journey to Adulthood to practice and sing with the choir. Rehearsals are in the sanctuary from 7-830pm on Thursday evenings. Youth must attend Thursday *and* Sunday to participate in the service.
